MATERIALS NEEDED:

For this sketchbook assignment, you will be creating a series of thumbnail sketches showing different designs needed for our next project. The designs can be abstract, or non-representational, Or, the designs can be realistic, or represents an ordinary object. Every design that you use, MUST show positive and negative space. If you do not remember learning about positive and negative space, please go back and view Sketchbook assignment \#5

assignment may be used for your white, cut-out cover sheet.
You will be creating 4 sets of 10 thumbnail sketches, each set showing one of the forms of balance; symmetry, asymmetry, radial, and approximate
